



## Google Chrome keyboard Shortcuts

### Tab and window shortcuts

<b>Ctrl+N</b>	Opens a new window.
<b>Ctrl+T</b>	Opens a new tab.
<b>Ctrl+Shift+N</b>	Opens a new window in incognito mode.
<b>Ctrl+O</b>	Opens a file from your computer in Google Chrome.
<b>Ctrl + click a link</b> or click a link with mousewheel	Opens the link in a new tab in the background.
<b>Ctrl+Shift + click a link</b> or press <b>Shift</b> and click a link with mousewheel.	Opens the link in a new tab and switches to the newly opened tab.
<b>Shift + click a link.</b>	Opens the link in a new window.
<b>Ctrl+Shift+T</b>	Reopens the last tab you've closed (up to 10 last closed tabs).
Drag a link to a tab. Drag a link to a blank area on the tab strip. Drag a tab out of the tab strip.	Opens the link in the tab. Opens the link in a new tab. Opens the tab in a new window.
Drag a tab out of the tab strip and into an existing window.	Opens the tab in the existing window.
<b>Ctrl+1</b> through <b>Ctrl+8</b>	Switches to the tab at the specified position number on the tab strip.
<b>Alt+F4</b>	Closes the current window.
<b>Ctrl+W</b> or <b>Ctrl+F4</b>	Closes the current tab or pop-up.
Click tab with mousewheel.	Closes the tab you clicked.
<b>Backspace</b> (or <b>Alt + Left</b> )	Goes to the previous page in your browsing history for the tab.
<b>Shift+Backspace</b> or <b>Alt + Right</b>	Goes to the next page in your browsing history for the tab.
Click Forward/Backward button with mousewheel.	Opens the button destination in a new tab in the background.
Double click the blank area on the tab strip.	Maximizes or minimizes the window.
<b>Alt+Home</b>	Opens homepage in current window.

### Text shortcuts

<b>Ctrl+C</b>	Copies highlighted text to the clipboard.
<b>Ctrl+V</b> or <b>Shift+Insert</b>	Pastes content from the clipboard.
<b>Ctrl+Shift+V</b>	Paste content from the clipboard without formatting.
<b>Ctrl+X</b> or <b>Shift+Delete</b>	Deletes the highlighted content and copies it to the clipboard.

### Google Chrome feature shortcuts

<b>Alt+F</b> or <b>Alt+E</b>	Opens the wrench menu, which lets you customize and control settings in Google Chrome.
<b>Ctrl+Shift+B</b>	Toggles the bookmarks bar on and off.
<b>Ctrl+H</b>	Opens the History page.
<b>Ctrl+J</b>	Opens the Downloads page.
<b>Shift+Esc</b>	Opens the Task Manager.
<b>Ctrl+Shift+Delete</b>	Opens the Clear Browsing Data dialog.

### Address bar shortcuts

Type a search term, then press <b>Enter</b> .	Performs a search using your default search engine.
Type a search engine keyword, press <b>Space</b> , type a search term, and press <b>Enter</b> .	Performs a search using the search engine associated with the keyword.
Begin typing a search engine URL, press <b>Tab</b> when prompted, type a search term, and press <b>Enter</b> .	Performs a search using the search engine associated with the URL.
<b>Ctrl+Enter</b>	Adds www. and .com to your input in the address bar and open the resulting URL.
Type a URL, then press <b>Alt+Enter</b> .	Opens the URL in a new tab.
<b>Ctrl+L</b> or <b>Alt+D</b>	Highlights the URL.
<b>Ctrl+K</b> or <b>Ctrl+E</b>	Places a '?' in the address bar. Type a search term after the question mark to perform a search using your default search engine.
<b>Ctrl</b> and the left arrow together.	Moves your cursor to the preceding key term in the address bar
<b>Ctrl</b> and the right arrow together.	Moves your cursor to the next key term in the address bar
<b>Ctrl+Backspace</b>	Deletes the key term that precedes your cursor in the address bar
Select an entry in the address bar drop-down menu with your keyboard arrows, then press <b>Shift+Delete</b> .	Deletes the entry from your browsing history, if possible.
Click an entry in the address bar drop-down menu with your middle mouse button (or mousewheel).	Opens the entry in a new tab in the background.
Press <b>Page Up</b> or <b>Page Down</b> when the address bar drop-down menu is visible.	Selects the first or last entry in the drop-down menu.

### Webpage shortcuts

<b>Ctrl+P</b>	Prints your current page.
<b>Ctrl+S</b>	Saves your current page.
<b>F5</b> or <b>Ctrl+R</b>	Reloads your current page.
<b>Esc</b>	Stops the loading of your current page.
<b>Ctrl+F</b>	Opens the find bar.
Click the middle mouse button (or mousewheel).	Activates auto-scrolling. As you move your mouse, the page automatically scrolls according to the direction of the mouse.
<b>Ctrl+F5</b> or <b>Shift+F5</b>	Reloads your current page, ignoring cached content.
Press <b>Alt</b> and click a link.	Downloads the target of the link.
<b>Ctrl+U</b>	Opens the source of your current page.
Drag a link to bookmarks bar	Saves the link as a bookmark.
<b>Ctrl+D</b>	Saves your current webpage as a bookmark.
<b>Ctrl+Shift+D</b>	Saves all open pages as bookmarks in a new folder.
<b>F11</b>	Opens your page in full-screen mode. Press <b>F11</b> again to exit full-screen.
<b>Ctrl</b> and scroll your mousewheel.	Enlarges or makes the text font smaller
<b>Ctrl+0</b>	Returns everything on the page to normal size.
<b>Space bar</b>	Scrolls down the web page.
<b>Home</b>	Goes to the top of the page.
<b>End</b>	Goes to the bottom of the page.

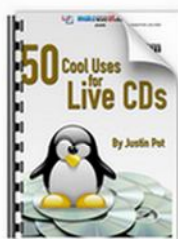
